Thank you for sharing your positive feedback with us on our very first issue last month! It was really encouraging. In this issue we bring to you some more insights and announcements while we celebrate the Plastic Free July.

The Plastic Conundrum

There is an increased pressure on hygiene due to the COVID-19 pandemic. States such as Delhi, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Kerala have relaxed restrictions on single use plastic (SUP). Further, the rise in production of medical plastic and piling up of plastic disposables has added to the strain on the already inadequate common biomedical waste management infrastructure. The GHG emissions are expected to increase.

An estimate by the Polytechnic of Turin says that when production and social activities will be gradually restarted, 1 billion masks and half a billion gloves per month will be needed. Considering the weight of each mask is about 4 grams this would entail the dispersion of over 40 thousand kg of plastic in nature.

So it's a difficult choice to make when it comes to deciding on plastic—is it hygiene & safety? or the protection of environment?

ThoughtWorks Social Hackathon 2020 co-powered by Ekonnect and LetsEndorse Development

ThoughtWorks partnered with <u>Ekonnect Knowledge Foundation</u> and <u>LetsEndorse Development</u>, an online ecosystem of social innovators, NGOs and communities to conduct **ThoughtWorks Social Hackathon 2020**. The hackathon aimed at inviting practicable socially conscious ideas from the student community across India. The hackathon launched 4 social challenge statements focusing on early epidemic detection, boosting organic farming, generating livelihoods from waste and promoting road safety, respectively.

Several student teams from over 60 academic institutions across India, submitted hundreds of ideas in response to the challenge statements. These submissions were reviewed by subject-matter experts from renowned institutions. Five teams under each of the four challenge statements were identified for the final round of the hackathon. They underwent a virtual mentoring session to refine the proposals. The mentoring sessions covered themes like impact incubation, pitching business plans and social innovation.

A virtual finale, on 27 June 2020, saw teams from Birla Institute of Technology & Science (BITS Pilani), Jaypee Institute of Information Technology (JIIT), Shri Ram College Of Commerce (SRCC), Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Technology (MAIT) and Guru Tegh Bahadur Institute of Technology (GTBIT) emerge as winners. The runners-up were teams from Hansraj College, Shri G. S. Institute of Technology (SGSITS), BITS Pilani and Indian Institute of Technology (BHU) Varanasi. These teams will receive a grant that will help them develop their winning solutions.
