Buy Nothing Day is an international day of protest against consumerism. Approximately 1.7 billion people worldwide now belong to the "consumer class"—the group of people characterized by diets of highly processed food, desire for bigger houses, more and bigger cars, higher levels of debt, and lifestyles devoted to the accumulation of non-essential goods. Most of the environmental issues we see today can be linked to consumption. Given the challenges we face on the availability and quality of our resources, we must abandon the linear growth model and wheel into Circular Economy. The first step towards a circular economy and a sustainable world is to 'REFUSE'. Let us contribute by celebrating the 'Buy Nothing Day on November 28th.

Awareness Program on Sustainable Public Procurement (SPP) for Indian Railways Officials

Environmental Management Centre in partnership with SWITCH-Asia and Adelphi successfully conducted a 3-day awareness program for Indian Railways Officials on Sustainable Public Procurement. This program was conducted virtually between 27-29 October 2020. It was attended by 40 key procurement officials of Indian Railways from senior and middle management. The program was a blend of lectures, breakout sessions for groupwork, assignments and interactions through Mentimeter. The program received an overall score of 8.8/10 from the participants.

Ekonnnect and FICCI's Masterclass on Circular Economy - 2020

Ekonnnect Knowledge Foundation in collaboration with FICCI hosted a one-day masterclass on circular economy on October 14th 2020. This masterclass was attended by 23 participants. The masterclass will be conducted by Dr. Prasad Modak. Topics like key concepts, status of circular economy (CE) in India, various business models, inspiring case studies and useful CE tools were included. A role-play exercise was conducted during the event and offline assignment on business models were allotted to the participants. Towards the end of Masterclass, a Panel Discussion chaired by Mr. Anirban Ghosh, Chair, FICCI was organized. Three CE entrepreneurs participated in this discussion. The organizations represented were AmplePac, Banyan Nation and Xynteo India. Participants gave a high score of 8.6/10 to this Masterclass.
